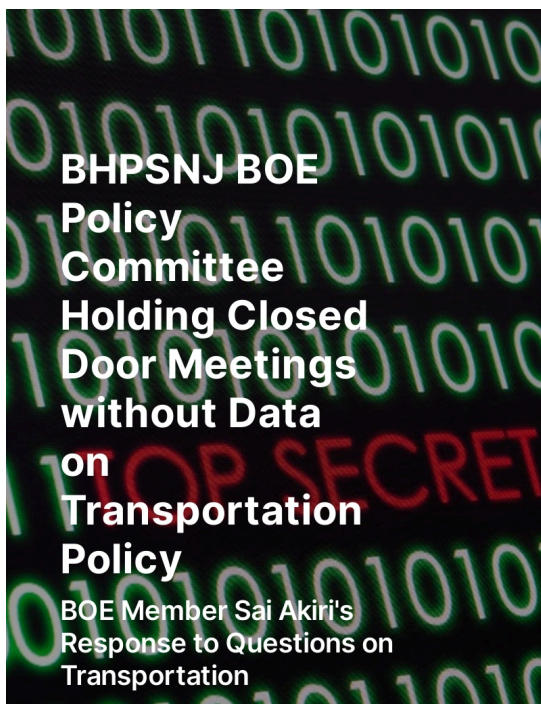


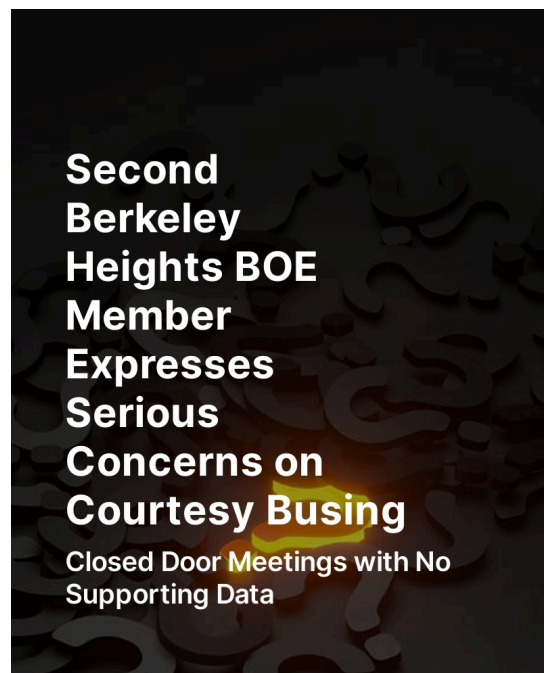


## BOE Policy Committee Off The Rails
