#### EMPLOYMENT CONTRACT FOR ACTING SUPERINTENDENT

This Employment Contract is made this day 28<sup>th</sup> of March 2024, by and between the BERKELEY HEIGHTS BOARD OF EDUCATION, with offices at 345 Plainfield Avenue, Berkeley Heights, N.J. 07922 (hereinafter referred to as "the Board") and Robert Nixon (hereinafter referred to as "Mr. Nixon"). Except as otherwise provided herein and during the term hereof, this Employment Contract supersedes all prior employment contracts between the parties hereto.

#### WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, Robert Nixon is currently serving as the Principal of Governor Livingston High School; and

WHEREAS, the Board and Mr. Nixon believe that a written employment contract is necessary to describe specifically their relationship and to serve as the basis of effective communication between them as they fulfill their governance and administrative functions in the operation of the education program of the schools; and

WHEREAS, the Acting Superintendent is the holder of a certificate of eligibility allowing him to be appointed as Acting Superintendent;

NOW, THEREFORE, based on the foregoing premises and the mutual provisions and covenants contained herein, the parties agree as follows:

#### 1. EMPLOYMENT TERM

The Board hereby agrees to employ Robert Nixon as Acting Superintendent of Schools for the period retroactive to March 19, 2024, through April 30, 2024. The parties acknowledge that this Contract must be approved by the Union County Executive County Superintendent in accordance with applicable laws and regulations.

Upon the parties' mutual written agreement and/or following the termination and/or expiration of this Contract or expiration of Robert Nixon's service as Acting Superintendent, the Acting Superintendent will be immediately returned to his position of Principal of Governor Livingston High School at the annual salary rate

of \$186,664.00 and he will resume employment under his existing employment agreement as Principal. Additionally, the Acting Superintendent shall continue accruing tenure and seniority in the position of Principal of Governor Livingston High School during the pendency of this Contract and shall transfer the benefit of unused or accumulated vacation, sick leave, and personal time afforded in this Contract.

#### 2. CERTIFICATION

The Acting Superintendent is the holder of a valid certificate of eligibility permitting him to be appointed to serve as Acting Superintendent in the State of New Jersey. In the event that the Acting Superintendent's certification and/or school administrator endorsement is revoked or surrendered, this Agreement shall be null and void.

#### 3. RESPONSIBILITIES

Acting Superintendent agrees to provide his best professional services to the Board and to faithfully perform, on an Acting basis, the duties of the position of Superintendent, as assigned by the Board and prescribed by federal and state law, the regulations of the State Board of Education and other federal and state agencies, the bylaws, policies and regulations of the Board, and job description for the position, as may be revised by the Board. Acting Superintendent also shall continue to perform the duties of the position of Principal of Governor Livingston High School.

#### 4. WORK SCHEDULE

The Acting Superintendent shall work five (5) days per week, at least eight (8) hours per day, Monday through Friday, commencing the week of March 19, 2024. The parties agree that the hours of the workday should be full workdays during regular business hours, but that the Acting Superintendent shall attend, without additional compensation, meetings of the Board, which may be conducted during evening hours.

#### 5. <u>COMPENSATION</u>

Currently, Mr. Nixon's annual salary is \$186,664.00 for serving as Principal of Governor Livingston High School. Mr. Nixon's salary equates to a per diem rate of \$717.94. During the term

of this contract, Mr. Nixon shall receive an additional per diem rate of \$350.00 to serve as Acting Superintendent, for a total per diem rate of \$1,067.94 for simultaneous service as Acting Superintendent and Principal of Governor Livingston High School. There are 28 workdays, 0 in service day and 3 paid holidays between March 19, 2024, and April 30, 2024, totaling 31 days. A per diem rate of \$1,067.94 per day for 31 days calculates to \$33,106.14 for Mr. Nixon's 1.5 months of service as Acting Superintendent/Principal Governor Livingston High School. This equates to a pay differential of \$10,850.00 for the 1.5 months of service as Acting Superintendent. This compensation shall be subject to applicable taxes and deductions and payment will be made in accordance with the policies and procedures of the Board, as well as state laws and regulations, including 0MB circulars in effect. However, it is understood and agreed that the per diem compensation is not pensionable and, therefore, no withholdings or contributions shall be made to TPAF on the per diem amount.

The Board will reimburse the Acting Superintendent, however, for business-related mileage at the rate prescribed by N.J.S.A. 18A:1 I-12 and the State's regulations regarding travel covered under Circular Letter 08-13-OMB, and any subsequent circular letters which may be issued by the State Office of Management and Budget, when he uses his personal vehicle for travel on Board related business, exclusive of travel to and from his place of residence, subject to the Acting Superintendent's compliance with the requirements of N.J.A.C. 6A:23A-7.13(e)(9) and (12) and-7.13(f) through (g), requiring the submission of a statement as to ownership of the vehicle used and certification that liability insurance is in effect for the vehicle, the monthly submission of reimbursement requests when in excess of twenty-five dollars (\$25), and the submission of any outstanding reimbursement request no later than end of the contract term.

#### 6. BENEFITS

As a pre-existing employee, the Acting Superintendent will continue to receive all the benefits and emoluments of employment, such as health insurance and paid leave, vacation, and holidays as he received in his position as Principal.

Specifically, the Acting Superintendent will receive the following benefits:

a. Sick Leave. The Acting Superintendent shall carry over his sick leave as accumulated and

accrued from his position as Principal of Governor Livingston High School. The Acting Superintendent shall be entitled to thirteen (13) sick days, prorated, to the term of this Employment Contract.

- b. <u>Personal Leave.</u> The Acting Superintendent shall receive four (4) personal days within a twelve (12) month period, prorated to the term of this Employment Contract. As much advance notice as possible of the request to take personal time will be given. The Acting Superintendent must document the use of personal days in the electronic attendance system prior to the start of the personal day. Unused personal days shall convert to sick days at the conclusion of the school year.
- c. <u>Vacation Leave</u>. The Acting Superintendent shall be entitled to receive 28 vacation days over a 12-month period, prorated to the term of this Employment Contract. The Acting Superintendent shall provide the Board with reasonable, advance notice of his intention to use vacation leave.
- d. <u>Holidays</u>. The Acting Superintendent shall be entitled to the following holidays under this contract: March 29, 2024, April 1, 2024, and April 2, 2024, as per the Central Office Administrative calendar.
- e. <u>Bereavement Leave.</u> Absence because of death in the Acting Superintendent's immediate household or family (including wife, husband, domestic partner/significant other/civil unions, mother, father, brother, sister, son, daughter, grandchild, mother-in-law, father-in-law, son-in-law, daughter-in-law) shall be allowed with full pay for a period not to exceed five (5) consecutive days in each case.

Absence due to the death in the non-immediate family (aunt, uncle, brother-in-law, sister-in-law, niece, nephew, grandmother, grandfather, or any person who has lived in the home of the employee for some time preceding death) shall be allowed with full pay, not to exceed three (3) days.

Bereavement days shall be taken at the time of death unless written permission is given by the Superintendent.

- f. <u>Health Benefits</u>. The Acting Superintendent shall continue to receive all health benefits that he received as Principal of Governor Livingston High School, and which he continues to receive. Pursuant to applicable law and regulation, the employee shall contribute an amount toward payment of premiums.
- g. <u>Membership Dues.</u> On a pro rata basis, the Board shall pay one-hundred (100%) percent of the Acting Superintendent's membership fees for membership in the New Jersey Association of School Administrators, and the County Association of School Administrators/County Round Table, for the period of time of service as Acting Superintendent.

#### 7. INDEMNIFICATION.

As Acting Superintendent, Mr. Nixon, shall be accorded all of the statutory protections related to the indeumification of school district officers and employees as set forth in N.J.S.A. 18A:16-6 and N.J.S.A. 18A:16-6.1 to the extent permitted by law.

#### 8. TERMINATION

- A. This Contract shall terminate, the Acting Superintendent's employment will cease, and no compensation shall thereafter be paid, under any one of the following circumstances:
  - 1. failure to possess/obtain proper certification;
  - revocation or suspension of the Acting Superintendent's certificate(s), in which case this contract shall be null and void as of the date of revocation, as required by N.J.S.A. 18A:17-15.1;
  - 3. forfeiture under N.J.S.A. 2C: 51-2;
  - 4. mutual agreement of the parties; or
  - 5. notification in writing by either party, upon at least fifteen (15) days' notice.
- B. In the event the Acting Superintendent is arrested and charged with a criminal offense, which could result in forfeiture under N.J.S.A. 2C: 51-2, the Board reserves the right to suspend him pending resolution of the criminal charges. Such suspension shall be with pay prior to indictment, and may be with or without pay, at the Board's discretion, subsequent to indictment, unless the Board certifies contractual tenure charges.

C. Nothing in this Contract shall affect the Board's rights with regard to suspension under N.J.S.A. 1SA:6-8.3 and applicable case law.

#### 10. RIGHT TO LEGAL COUNSEL

Mr. Nixon acknowledges that he has been informed of his rights to be represented by legal counsel regarding the negotiations, development, and approval of this Employment Contract and that the Board's legal counsel does not represent him in the matter. However, Mr. Nixon shall have the right to contact the Board Attorney for legal assistance on all other matters as the need arises in carrying out his duties.

#### 11. REVOCATION CLAUSE

The Parties hereto agree that in the event the Acting Superintendent's certification is permanently revoked, all provisions of this Employment Contract shall be null and void as of the date of the revocation, and if the Acting Superintendent is lawfully precluded from performing his duties by any Judgment, Order or direction of any court of competent jurisdiction or the Commissioner of Education, all provisions of this Employment Contract shall terminate and the Acting Superintendent's employment shall cease.

#### 12. SAVINOS CLAUSE

If, during the term of this Employment Contract, it is found that a specific clause of this Employment Contract is contrary to federal or state law, the remainder of the Employment Contract not affected by such ruling shall remain in full force and effect. The parties hereto represent to each other that they fully understand the terms and conditions of this Employment Contract and agree to be bound by same pursuant to the rules and regulations of the Department of Education and the laws of the State of New Jersey.

#### 13. MODIFICATION CLAUSE

The terms and conditions of this Employment Contract shall not be modified except by the written consent of both Parties hereto and review and approval by the Executive County Superintendent. Any amendments to this Employment Contract shall not create a new agreement

or agreement term but shall only constitute an amendment to the existing Employment Contract.

#### 14. SOLE AGREEMENT

This Employment Contract constitutes the sole agreement with respect to Mr. Nixon's service as Acting Superintendent and supersedes any prior understandings or written or oral agreements between the parties respecting his service or compensation as Acting Superintendent.

5116 EDUCATION OF HOMELESS CHILDREN AND YOUTHS

#### 5116 EDUCATION OF HOMELESS CHILDREN AND YOUTHS

The Board of Education will admit and enroll homeless children and youths in accordance with Federal and State laws and New Jersey Administrative Code. The Board of Education adopts this Policy to be in compliance with law and administrative code to ensure the enrollment of homeless children and youths in school and to respond to appeals made by parents or other parties related to the enrollment of homeless children and youths.

- The Board shall determine that a child or youth is homeless when the child or youth resides in a publicly or privately operated shelter designed to provide temporary living accommodations, including: hotels or motels; congregate shelters, including domestic violence and runaway shelters; transitional housing; and homes for adolescent mothers.
- A child or youth is also determined homeless when the child or youth resides in a public
  or private place not designated for or ordinarily used as a regular sleeping
  accommodation, including: cars or other vehicles including mobile homes; tents or other
  temporary shelters; parks; abandoned buildings; bus or train stations; or temporary
  shelters provided to migrant workers and their children on farm sites.
- A child or youth is determined homeless when the child or youth resides in the residence
  of relatives or friends where the homeless child or youth resides out of necessity because
  the child's or youth's family lacks a regular or permanent residence of its own.
- A child or youth is also determined homeless when the child or youth resides in substandard housing.
- The school district of residence for a homeless child or youth is responsible for the education of the child and shall assume all responsibilities as required in N.J.A.C. 6A:17-2.3.
- The school district of residence for a homeless child or youth means the school district in which the parent of a homeless child or youth resided prior to becoming homeless.
- The school district liaison designated by the Superintendent of Schools for the education of homeless children and youths is **The Mountain Park Elementary School Principal**.
- The school district liaison will facilitate communication and cooperation between the school district of residence and the school district where the homeless child or youth resides and shall assume all responsibilities as outlined in N.J.A.C. 6A:17-2.4(a).
- When a homeless child or youth resides in a school district, the school district liaison shall notify the liaison of the school district of residence within twenty-four hours of receiving notification from the parent, a shelter director, or an involved agency. Upon

notification of the need for enrollment of a homeless child or youth, the liaison in the school district of residence shall coordinate enrollment procedures immediately based upon the best interest of the child pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:17-2.5(b).

The Superintendent of the school district of residence or designee shall decide in which school district the homeless child or youth shall be enrolled in accordance with the provisions of N.J.A.C. 6A:17-2.5.

Unless parental rights have been terminated by a court of competent jurisdiction, the parent retains all rights under N.J.A.C. 6A:17-2.

- When a dispute occurs regarding the determination of homelessness or the determination of the school district of enrollment made by the school district of residence, the Superintendent(s) or the designee(s) of the involved district(s) or the child's or youth's parent(s) shall immediately notify the Executive County Superintendent of Schools, who, in consultation with the New Jersey Department of Education's (NJDOE) McKinney-Vento Homeless Education Coordinator or the Coordinator's designee, shall immediately decide the child's or youth's status.
- If a dispute remains between the parent and the involved school district(s) following the Executive County Superintendent's determination, the parent or the involved district Board(s) of Education may appeal to the Commissioner of Education for determination pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:3, Controversies and Disputes.
- When a school district designated as the school district of residence disputes its designation as the school district of residence, or where no designation can be agreed upon by the involved school districts, the Superintendent(s) or designee(s) of the involved school districts shall immediately notify the Executive County Superintendent of Schools. The Executive County Superintendent shall make a determination immediately, if possible, but no later than within forty-eight hours and, when necessary, in consultation with the NJDOE's Homeless Education Coordinator or the Coordinator's designee.
- If the dispute regarding determination of the school district of residence does not involve the determination of homelessness and/or school district of enrollment, the school district disputing the Executive County Superintendent's determination may appeal to the NJDOE pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:23A-19.2(d), (e), and (f) and request a determination from the NJDOE Division of Administration and Finance.
- If an appeal of a determination of school district of residence also includes an appeal of the determination of homelessness and/or school district of enrollment, the appeal shall be submitted to the Commissioner of Education pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:3, Controversies and Disputes.

- Any dispute or appeal shall not delay the homeless child's or youth's immediate enrollment or continued enrollment in the school district.
- The homeless child or youth shall be enrolled in the school district in which enrollment

- Disputes and appeals involving the services provided to a homeless child or youth with a disability shall be made pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:14.

Notwithstanding the provisions of N.J.S.A. 18A:38-1, 18A:7B-12, or 18A:7B-12.1, or any other section of law to the contrary, any student who moves from one school district to another as a result of being homeless due to an act of terrorism or due to a natural disaster which results in the declaration of a state of emergency or disaster by the State or by the Federal government, may continue to enroll in the school district in which the parent or guardian last resided prior to becoming homeless for up to two full school years after the act of terrorism or natural disaster; and during the two-year period, if the student is enrolled in the district in which the parent last resided prior to becoming homeless and the student's parent remains homeless for that period, the student shall attend that district tuition-free and that district shall provide the student transportation to and from school in accordance with N.J.S.A. 18A:7B-12.3.

- Financial responsibility, including the payment of tuition for the homeless child or youth, will be in accordance with N.J.A.C. 6A:17-2.8. The school district of residence shall list the child on its annual Application for State School Aid (ASSA) pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:7F-33 until the parent establishes a permanent residence or is deemed domiciled in another jurisdiction pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:38-1.d. At that time, the school district of residence or the school district in which the parent has been deemed domiciled shall no longer list the student on its ASSA. The State shall assume fiscal responsibility for the tuition of the child pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:7B-12.1 and shall pay the tuition to the school district in which the child or youth is currently enrolled until the parent establishes a permanent residence or is deemed domiciled in another jurisdiction pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:38-1.d. under the circumstances outlined in N.J.A.C. 6A:17-2.8(c).
- On or before December 31 of each year, the district shall report to the Office of Homelessness Prevention in the Department of Community Affairs an accounting of each instance in which the district is made aware that a student enrolled in the district because the student's parent moved to the district as a result of being homeless in accordance with N.J.S.A. 18A:38-1.f.

#### R 5116 EDUCATION OF HOMELESS CHILDREN AND YOUTHS

#### A. Definitions – N.J.A.C. 6A:17-1.2

- 1. "Best interest determination" means the school placement decision made by Division of Child Protection and Permanency (DCP&P) based on the factors considered, as set forth at N.J.S.A. 30:4C-26b.
- 2. "Career or technical education" or "CTE" means as defined in N.J.A.C. 6A:19-1.2.
- 3. "DCP&P" means the Division of Child Protection and Permanency, which is a division in the New Jersey Department of Children and Families (DCF) that is responsible for the placement of children in resource family care, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 30:4C-26b.
- 4. "Educational stability school district notification" means the notification provided by DCP&P to the school district, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 30:4C-26b.h.
- 5. "Enroll" or "enrollment" means attending classes and participating fully in school activities.
- 6. "Homeless child" means a child or youth who lacks a fixed, regular, and adequate residence, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:7B-12, N.J.A.C. 6A:17-2.2, and B. below.
- 7. "Immediate" or "immediately" means at the instant the need for placement is made known.
- 8. "Parent" means the natural or adoptive parent, legal guardian, resource family care parent, surrogate parent, or person acting in the place of a parent, such as the person with whom the child legally resides or a person legally responsible for the child's welfare.
- 9. "Point of contact" means the employee identified in each school district who facilitates all activities needed to ensure enrollment and attendance of children in resource family care.
- 10. "Resource family care" means twenty-four-hour substitute care for children placed away from their parent(s) and for whom DCP&P has placement and care responsibility. The term is synonymous with "foster care" as defined in the Federal Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA), as reauthorized by the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA), and includes "resource family home" found

elsewhere in the New Jersey Administrative Code and in the New Jersey Statutes Annotated.

- 11. "School district liaison for the education of homeless children and youths" means the person identified in each school district who facilitates all activities needed to ensure the enrollment and attendance of homeless children and youths.
- 12. "School district of residence" for a homeless child or youth means the school district in which the parent of a homeless child or youth resided prior to becoming homeless. It may not be the school district in which the student currently resides. This term is synonymous with "school district or origin" referenced in the McKinney-Vento Homeless Education Assistance Act. "School district of residence" for a student in a State facility means the school district in which the parent with whom the student lived prior to placement in a State facility currently resides, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:7B-12.b. In the case of a child placed in resource family care prior to September 9, 2010, in accordance with N.J.S.A. 18A:7B-12, the "school district of residence" means the school district in which the resource family care parent(s) resides. In the case of a child placed in resource family care on or after September 9, 2010, in accordance with N.J.S.A. 18A:7B-12, the "school district of resident" means the present school district of residence of the parent(s) with whom the child lived prior to the most recent placement in resource family care.
- 13. "School of origin" for a child in resource family care means the school district in which a child was enrolled prior to a change in the child's care, custody, or guardianship. If a child's resource family care placement changes, the school or origin would then be considered the school district in which the child is enrolled at the time of the placement change.
- 14. "State agency" means the New Jersey Department of Human Services, the New Jersey Department of Correction, the New Jersey Department of Children and Families, or the New Jersey Juvenile Justice Commission.
- 15. "State facility" means residential and day programs operated by, contracted with, or specified by the New Jersey Department of Human Services, the New Jersey Department of Correction, the New Jersey Department of Children and Families, or the New Jersey Juvenile Justice Commission.
- 16. "Transitional living facility" means a temporary facility that provides housing to a child due to domestic violence, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:7B-12.1.
- 17. "Unaccompanied youth" means a youth not in the physical custody of a parent at the time of enrollment.
- B. Determination of Homelessness N.J.A.C. 6A:17-2.2

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### R 5116 EDUCATION OF HOMELESS CHILDREN AND YOUTHS

- 1. The Board of Education for the school district of residence shall determine that a child or youth is homeless for the purposes of N.J.A.C. 6A:17-2, Policy 5116, and this Regulation when the child or youth resides in any of the following:
  - A publicly or privately operated shelter designed to provide temporary living accommodations, including: hotels or motels; congregate shelters, including domestic violence and runaway shelters; transitional housing; and homes for adolescent mothers;
  - b. A public or private place not designated for or ordinarily used as a regular sleeping accommodation, including: cars or other vehicles including mobile homes; tents or other temporary shelters; parks; abandoned buildings; bus or train stations; or temporary shelters provided to migrant workers and their children on farm sites;
  - c. The residence of relatives or friends where the homeless child or youth resides out of necessity because their family lacks a regular or permanent residence of its own; or
  - d. Substandard housing.
- C. Responsibilities of the School District of Residence N.J.A.C. 6A:17-2.3
  - 1. The school district of residence for a homeless child or youth shall be responsible for the education of the child and shall:
    - a. Determine the school district in which the child shall be enrolled after consulting with the parent pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:17-2.5 and E. below;
    - b. Pay the cost of tuition pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:38-19, when the child attends school in another school district; and
    - c. Provide for transportation for the child pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:27-6.2.
  - 2. The determination of the homeless child's or youth's school district of residence shall be made by the Superintendent of the school district of residence or designee, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:17-2.4 and D. below based upon information received from the parent, a shelter provider, another school district, or an involved agency.
  - 3. The school district identified in accordance with N.J.S.A. 18A:7B-12 as the school district of residence for a homeless child or youth shall be the school district of residence until the parent establishes a permanent residence. Financial responsibility will remain with the homeless child's school district of residence

until the family is deemed domiciled in another jurisdiction, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:38-1.d.

- D. Designation of School District Liaisons and Their Responsibilities N.J.A.C. 6A:17-2.4
  - 1. The Superintendent identifies the <u>Mountain Park Principal</u> as the school district liaison for the education of homeless children or youths. The school district liaison shall:
    - Facilitate communication and cooperation between the school district of residence and the school district where the homeless child or youth resides;
    - b. Develop procedures to ensure a homeless child or youth residing in the school district is enrolled and attending school pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:17-2.5 and E. below;
    - c. Ensure homeless families, children, and youths receive educational services for which they are eligible, including Head Start programs, preschool programs administered by the Board, and referrals to health care, dental, mental health, and other appropriate services;
    - d. Inform parents of homeless children and youths of the educational and related opportunities available to their children and ensure that parents are provided with meaningful opportunities to participate in the education of their children;
    - e. Ensure that public notice of the educational rights of homeless children and youths is disseminated where such children receive services, such as schools, family shelters, and soup kitchens;
    - f. Ensure enrollment disputes are resolved pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:17-2.7 and G. below;
    - g. Ensure the parent of a homeless child or youth, or any unaccompanied youth, is fully informed of all transportation services, including transportation to the school district of residence, and is assisted in accessing transportation to the school selected under N.J.A.C. 6A:17-2.5 and E. below;
    - h. Assist the parent to obtain the homeless child's or youth's medical records or required immunizations; and

- i. Assist an unaccompanied youth to ensure the youth is enrolled in, and is receiving, all services pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:17, Policy 5116, and this Regulation.
- 2. When a homeless child or youth resides in a school district, the school district liaison shall notify the liaison of the school district of residence within twenty-four hours of receiving notification from the parent, a shelter director, or an involved agency.
- 3. Upon notification of the need for enrollment of a homeless child or youth, the liaison in the school district of residence shall coordinate enrollment procedures immediately based upon the best interest of the child, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:17-2.5(b) and E.2. below.

#### E. School District Enrollment – N.J.A.C. 6A:17-2.5

- 1. The Superintendent of the school district of residence or designee shall decide in which school district the homeless child or youth shall be enrolled as follows:
  - a. Enroll the homeless child or youth in the school district of residence to the extent feasible, except when doing so is contrary to the wishes of the homeless child's or youth's parent;
  - b. Continue the homeless child's or youth's education in the school district of last attendance if it is not the school district of residence; or
  - c. Enroll the homeless child in the school district where the child resides.
- 2. The Superintendent of the school district of residence or designee shall decide the school district of enrollment of a homeless child or youth based on what is determined to be in the best interest of the child or youth after considering:
  - a. The enrollment of the homeless child or youth in the school district of residence to the extent feasible, except when doing so is contrary to the wishes of the child's or youth's parent.
  - b. The continuity of the child's educational program;
  - c. The eligibility of the child for special instructional programs, including, but not limited to, bilingual, gifted and talented, special education, early childhood, and career and technical education programs; and
  - d. The distance, travel time, and safety factors in coordinating transportation services from the residence to the school.

- 3. The Superintendent of the school district of residence or designee shall determine the child's or youth's school district of enrollment immediately after consultation with the parent. The school district of residence shall adhere to the following procedures:
  - a. Enrollment decisions shall be made immediately upon notification of the need for enrollment. When the decision is made, the child or youth shall be enrolled immediately. If a dispute arises regarding enrollment of a homeless child or youth, the homeless child or youth shall be immediately enrolled in the school district in which enrollment is sought by the parent, pending resolution of the dispute pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:17-2.7 and G. below.
  - b. Consultation with the parent regarding the enrollment decision and the right to appeal the decision shall be documented in writing.
  - c. A decision to enroll a homeless child or youth in a school district other than the school district of residence or the school district requested by the parent shall be explained in writing and provided to the parent.
- 4. When a decision is made to enroll the child or youth in a school district other than the school district of residence, the Superintendent or designee of the school district of residence shall forward to the new school district all relevant school and health records consistent with the provisions of N.J.A.C. 6A:32-7.
- 5. When a homeless child or youth with a disability is enrolled in a school district other than the school district of residence, the school district of enrollment shall treat the student as a transfer student pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:14, Special Education.
- 6. When the school district of residence for a homeless child or youth cannot be determined, the Superintendent or designee of the school district in which the child or youth currently resides shall enroll the child or youth immediately in the school district of the current residence or the school district of last attendance.
- 7. The school district selected pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:17-2, Policy 5116, and this Regulation shall immediately enroll the homeless child or youth, even if the child or youth is unable to produce records normally required for enrollment such as previous academic records, medical records, proof of residency, or other documentation.
- 8. Enrollment in the school district of residence; enrollment in the school district of last attendance, if not the school district of residence; or enrollment in the school district where the child or youth resides shall continue for the duration of homelessness, including when a family becomes homeless between academic

years, and also for the remainder of the academic year if the homeless child or youth becomes permanently housed during the academic year.

- F. Parental Rights N.J.A.C. 6A:17-2.6
  - 1. Unless parental rights have been terminated by a court of competent jurisdiction, the parent retains all rights under N.J.A.C. 6A:17-2, Policy 5116, and this Regulation.
- G. Disputes and Appeals N.J.A.C. 6A:17-2.7
  - 1. When a dispute occurs regarding the determination of homelessness or the determination of the school district of enrollment made by the school district of residence, the Superintendent(s) or designee(s) of the involved school district(s) or the child's or youth's parent(s) shall immediately notify the Executive County Superintendent. In consultation with the New Jersey Department of Education's (NJDOE) McKinney-Vento Homeless Education Coordinator or the Coordinator's designee, the Executive County Superintendent shall immediately decide the child's or youth's status. If a dispute remains between the parent and the involved school district(s) following the Executive County Superintendent's determination, the parent or the involved district Board(s) of Education may appeal to the Commissioner of Education for a determination pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:3, Controversies and Disputes.
  - 2. When a school district designated as the school district of residence disputes its designation as the school district of residence, or where no designation can be agreed upon by the involved school districts, the Superintendent(s) or designee(s) of the involved school districts shall immediately notify the Executive County Superintendent. The Executive County Superintendent shall make a determination immediately, if possible, but no later than within forty-eight hours and, when necessary, in consultation with the NJDOE's Homeless Education Coordinator, or the Coordinator's designee.
    - a. If the dispute regarding determination of the school district of residence does not involve the determination of homelessness and/or school district of enrollment, the school district disputing the Executive County Superintendent's determination may appeal to the NJDOE pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:23A-19.2(d), (e), and (f), and request a determination from the Division of Finance.
    - b. If an appeal of a determination of the school district of residence also includes an appeal of the determination of homelessness and/or school

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district of enrollment, the appeal shall be submitted to the Commissioner pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:3, Controversies and Disputes.

- 3. Any dispute or appeal shall not delay the homeless child's or youth's immediate enrollment or continued enrollment in the school district. The homeless child or youth shall be enrolled in the school district in which enrollment or continued enrollment is sought by the parent, pending resolution of the dispute or appeal.
- 4. Disputes and appeals involving the services provided to a homeless child or youth with a disability shall be made pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:14.

## H. Tuition – N.J.A.C. 6A:17-2.8

- 1. When the homeless child or youth is enrolled in a school district other than the school district of residence, the school district of residence shall pay to the school district of enrollment the tuition costs pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:38-19 until the parent establishes a permanent residence or is deemed domiciled in another jurisdiction pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:38-1.d. At that time, the school district of residence or the school district in which the parent has been deemed domiciled shall pay tuition to the school district of enrollment.
- 2. The school district of residence shall list the child on its annual Application for State School Aid (ASSA) pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:7F-33 until the parent establishes a permanent residence or is deemed domiciled in another jurisdiction pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:38-1.d. At that time, the school district of residence or the school district in which the parent has been deemed domiciled shall list the student on its ASSA.
- 3. The State shall assume fiscal responsibility for the tuition of the child or youth pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:7B-12.1 and shall pay the tuition to the school district in which the child or youth is currently enrolled until the parent establishes a permanent residence or is deemed domiciled in another jurisdiction pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:38-1.d., under the following circumstances:
  - a. If the school district of residence cannot be determined for the homeless child or youth;
  - b. If the school district of residence is outside of the State; or
  - c. If a child or youth resides in a domestic violence shelter, homeless shelter, or transitional living facility located in a school district other than the school district of residence for more than a year during the placement pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:7B-12.d. and 12.1.

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4. When the State assumes fiscal responsibility for the tuition of a homeless child or youth under the circumstances at N.J.A.C. 6A:17-2.8(c) and H.3. above, the State shall pay to the school district in which the child or youth is enrolled the weighted base per pupil amount calculated pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:7F-49 and the appropriate security and special education categorical aids per pupil pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:7F-55 and 56.

#### 6421 PURCHASES BUDGETED

The Board of Education directs the establishment of procedures for the purchase of budgeted goods and services that will make prudent use of district resources and yield the maximum value for the school district. The Superintendent of Schools and the School Business Administrator shall authorize all purchases that are within a budget line item and are consistent with the purpose for which the funds were appropriated

No purchase order may be placed until the School Business Administrator has determined whether the proposed purchase is subject to bid, whether sufficient funds exist in the line item, and whether the goods are available elsewhere in the district.

Whenever the estimated value of a purchase or contract for goods or services other than professional services N.J.S.A. 18A:18A-5(1) and work by employees of the Board N.J.S.A. 18A:18A-5(3) is fifteen percent or more of the bid threshold established in accordance with N.J.S.A. 18A:18A-3 and N.J.S.A. 18A:18A-37 and is not made under a state contract, the purchasing agent shall, whenever practicable, solicit at least two quotations from independent vendors. All quotations received will be attached to and retained with a copy of the voucher used to pay the vendor.

The purchase or contract may be awarded on the basis of the lowest responsible quotation received or to the vendor who submits the quotation most advantageous to the Board on the basis of price and other factors. If it is determined that it is impractical to seek quotations for an extraordinary, unspecifiable service or that the purchase or contract for which quotations were sought should not be awarded on the basis of the lowest quotation received, the reasons for that determination will be set forth in writing and attached to the resulting purchase order or contract.

Supplies commonly used in the various schools will be standardized to the extent that it is educationally feasible to do so. Alternate suggestions will be made to a requisitioner if better service, delivery, economy, or utility can be achieved by a change in the proposed order.

When a purchase order is placed or a contract entered, the School Business Administrator shall commit the expenditure against a specific budget line item or project category in order to guard against the creation of liabilities in excess of appropriations.

# 8600 STUDENT TRANSPORTATION POLICY

The Board of Education shall transport eligible students to and from school and school related activities in accordance with N.J.S.A. 18A:39-1 et seq., N.J.A.C. 6A:27-1 et seq., and Board policy. Transportation shall be provided only to eligible public and nonpublic school students, authorized school staff members, and adults serving as approved chaperones.

Nonpublic school transportation or aid in lieu of transportation shall be provided for resident students in accordance with N.J.S.A. 18A:39-1 et seq. and N.J.A.C. 6A:27-2.1 et seq.

Charter or renaissance school transportation or aid in lieu of transportation shall be provided for resident students in accordance with N.J.S.A. 18A:39-1 et seq. and N.J.A.C. 6A:27-3.1 et seq.

The Board <u>may</u> provide transportation to and from school for public school students less than remote if a student resides on an identified "hazardous" road.

### For Governor Livingston High School:

The Board will not be responsible for the transportation of nonresident students to or from school, except that transportation to and from school will be provided for homeless students; students residing in group homes; students residing in resource family homes; and students residing in shared custody homes pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:27-6.2, 6.3, 6.4, and 6.5.

Transportation services will be provided in accordance with N.J.A.C. 6A:27-2.2(c)1, and this Policy to a nonpublic school located outside the State not more than twenty miles from the student's home.

#### **Student Transportation - Policy**

The Board may require the compilation of a list of the names of students being transported by a school bus to a school-sponsored activity, including but not limited to, field trips or interscholastic sports

programs. The staff member(s) supervising the school-sponsored activity shall create a list of students on each school bus and submit it to the Principal or designee, and the Principal or designee shall maintain the list for use in the case of an emergency in accordance with N.J.A.C. 6A:27-11.5.]

When the schools of this district are closed for inclement weather or other conditions, no transportation will be provided for students enrolled in any public, nonpublic, charter school, and/or renaissance school.

The Board shall utilize cooperative/coordinated transportation services in accordance with the provisions of N.J.S.A. 18A:39-11.1 et seq. and N.J.A.C. 6A:27-10.1 et seq. The Board shall utilize one of the agencies prior to determining to pay aid in lieu of transportation if in the prior year payments in lieu of transportation were provided. The Board will provide to the cooperative/coordinated transportation services any unique limitations or restrictions of the required transportation.

Vehicles used to transport students to and from school or school related activities shall meet standards, registration, and inspection requirements of the New Jersey Department of Education (NJDOE), the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission (NJMVC), and any applicable Federal regulations. The operation and fiscal management of the district's transportation system shall be conducted in strict accordance with rules of the New Jersey State Board of Education and the NJDOE.

In addition to the provisions of any State law, rule, or regulation containing more stringent requirements, provided that those requirements are compatible with Federal law, and notwithstanding the provisions of any State law, rule, or regulation to the contrary, school bus operations in the State shall comply with the requirements outlined in N.J.S.A. 39:3B-27.

#### R 8600 STUDENT TRANSPORTATION

General Requirements - Students Remote from School

The Board will transport:

- 1. Students who reside remote, as defined in N.J.S.A. 18A:39-1. and N.J.A.C. 6A:27-1 (a)1. and (a)2., from their assigned district school of attendance;
- 2. Nonpublic school students who reside remote from their school of attendance and meet the eligibility criteria of N.J.A.C. 6A:27-2.1 et seq.;
- 3. Charter school or renaissance school students pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:27-3.1 et seq.;
- 4. Students with special needs shall be provided transportation in accordance with N.J.S.A. 18A:39-1 et seq. and with their Individualized Education Program (IEP) pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:27-5.
- 5. School choice students pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:27-4.1 et seq.; and
- 6. Special population students pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:27-6.2 through 6.5.

**Hazardous Routes** 

The Board will approve all bus routes each school year. Bus routes for all non-remote students who must walk to and from school along hazardous routes will be designated and approved by the Board. The Board will approve a list of hazardous routes in the district requiring the courtesy busing of students and the criteria used in designating the hazardous routes. In adopting Policy and Regulation 8600 and the list of hazardous routes, the Board may consider, but shall not be limited to, the criteria outlined in N.J.S.A. 18A:39-1. as follows:

- 1. Population density;
- 2. Traffic volume;
- Average vehicle velocity;
- 4. Existence or absence of sufficient sidewalk space;
- 5. Roads and highways that are winding or have blind curves;
- 6. Roads and highways with steep inclines and declines;
- 7. Drop-offs that are in close proximity to a sidewalk;
- 8. Bridges or overpasses that must be crossed to reach the school;

- 9. Train tracks or trestles that must be crossed to reach the school; and
- 10. Busy roads or highways that must be crossed to reach the school.

The school district shall work in conjunction with municipal officials in determining the criteria necessary for the designation of a hazardous route.

Cooperative/Coordinated Transportation Services

A. The Board shall utilize cooperative/coordinated transportation services in accordance with the provisions of N.J.S.A. 18A:39-11.1 et seq. and N.J.A.C 6A:27-10.1 et seq.

#### School Bus Use and Standards

A. All school buses bid or purchased shall be equipped in accordance with the requirements of N.J.S.A. 39:3B-10 – School Bus Safety Equipment.

B. School bus drivers and all school bus passengers shall be required to wear seat belts when transported in school buses so equipped. Seat belts shall be fastened when the driver and passengers board the vehicle and they shall be kept fastened at all times while on board the vehicle. Seat belts may be unfastened only when the individual is departing the vehicle. The Board further requires that drivers and passengers using private vehicles to transport students wear seat belts in the same manner.

C. There shall be displayed on every bus subject to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 39:3B-1, signs or legends which will, insofar as practicable, inform the driver of any vehicle concerning the duty imposed upon him/her by law with respect to passing a bus, while it is loading or unloading. The signs or legends shall be in a color, form, and design as will meet the requirements prescribed by the State Board of Education.

Any agency, Board of Education, nonpublic school, or school bus contractor operating a school bus subject to the provisions of N.J.S.A.

39:3B-1 shall display across the rear of the school bus a telephone number, website address, or other identifying information which shall allow the public to report a bus driver's misconduct while operating the school bus to the Board of Education or nonpublic school for which the school bus provides transportation. The lettering shall be of a color that contrasts with the color of the school bus.

The Board of Education or nonpublic school shall comply with New Jersey Department of Education (NJDOE) regulations regarding: the appropriate Board of Education or nonpublic school official or designee to address and respond to a complaint of school bus driver misconduct; the appropriate actions which a Board of Education or nonpublic school may take to respond to a complaint of school bus driver misconduct; and the time period during which a Board of Education or nonpublic school may act to respond to a complaint of school bus driver misconduct in accordance with the provisions of N.J.S.A. 39:3B-2.1.

D. The Board requires every school bus bid or purchased that is used to transport public, non-public, charter, and/or renaissance school students to be equipped with a crossing control arm at the right front

corner of the bus. The arm must open and extend out from the bus at least five feet each time the bus door is opened.

E. School bus purchase, use, and standards must meet Federal and State standards and must be in accordance with N.J.A.C. 6A:27-7.1 et seq. and N.J.S.A. 18A:18A-1 et seq. — Public School Contracts Law.

#### Operation and Management of Transportation Systems

- A. The Transportation Supervisor shall
- 1. Prepare a map of the district on which each bus stop and bus route is indicated or, alternatively, prepare an itinerary of bus routes that may be used in conjunction with a map of the school district;
- 2. Prepare and promulgate procedures to be followed in the event of a bus emergency, bus safety, bus driver training and rules governing the conduct of all students transported by the Board in accordance with N.J.A.C. 6A:27-11.1 et seq. and 6A:27-12.1 et seq.;
- 3. Maintain such records and make such reports regarding school transportation as are required by the State Board of Education; and
- 4. Prepare the specifications for each bus route or contract for which proposals will be sought by the Board in accordance with N.J.A.C. 6A:27-9.1 et seq.
- B. The operation and fiscal management of the district's transportation system shall be conducted in strict accordance with rules of the State Board of Education and the NJDOE

## 2270 RELIGION IN THE SCHOOLS

The Board of Education recognizes that religious belief and disbelief are matters of personal conviction rather than governmental authority and the students of this district are protected by the First Amendment of the United States Constitution and by Article I, Paragraph 4 of the New Jersey State Constitution from the establishment of religion in the schools. The First Amendment requires public school officials to show neither favoritism toward nor hostility against religious expression such as prayer.

As a condition of receiving Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965 (ESEA) funds, the Board of Education must annually certify in writing to the New Jersey Department of Education that no Board policy prevents, or otherwise denies participation in, constitutionally protected prayer in public elementary and secondary schools, as detailed in the United States Department of Education's Guidance on Constitutionally Protected Prayer and Religious Expression in Public Elementary and Secondary Schools (USDOE Guidance). The Board must provide this certification to the New Jersey Department of Education by October 1 of each year during which the Board participates in an ESEA program. The USDOE Guidance provides information on the current state of the law concerning constitutionally protected prayer and religious expression in public elementary and secondary schools.

The following activities as outlined in the USDOE Guidance will be permitted upon applying the governing constitutional principles in particular public school contexts related to prayer: prayer and religious exercise during non-instructional time; organized prayer groups and activities; teachers, administrators, and other school employees; moments of silence; accommodation of prayer and religious exercise during instructional time; student assemblies and noncurricular events; prayer at graduation; and/or baccalaureate ceremonies.

The following activities as outlined in the USDOE Guidance will be permitted upon applying constitutional principles regarding religious expression other than prayer in particular public school contexts: religious literature; teaching about religion; student dress codes and policies; religious expression in class assignments and homework; and/or excusals for religious activities.

In addition to the constitutional principles outlined in this Policy and the USDOE Guidance, public schools may also be subject to requirements under Federal and State laws relevant to prayer and religious expression. Such Federal and State laws may not; however, obviate or conflict with a public school's Federal constitutional obligations described in the USDOE Guidance. The Equal Access Act, 20 U.S.C. Section 4071, is designed to ensure that student religious activities are accorded the same access to Federally funded public secondary school facilities as are student secular activities.

The United States Department of Justice has developed guidance for interpreting the Equal Access Act's requirements outlined in the USDOE Guidance in the area of general provisions, prayer service and worship exercises, means of publicized meetings, lunch-time and recess, and leadership of religious student groups.

# 5460.02 BRIDGE YEAR PILOT PROGRAM (M)

M

The New Jersey Commissioner of Education has established a three-year "Bridge Year Pilot Program," under which each school district with a high school shall offer students in the graduating classes of 2021 and 2022 the opportunity to pursue a Bridge Year during the year immediately following their senior year of high school, in accordance with the provisions of P.L. 2020 c.41. The purpose of the Bridge Year Pilot Program shall be to provide participating students an additional year to address learning loss and missed opportunities in extracurricular activities, including spring sports programs, as a result of the public health state of emergency caused by the COVID-19 pandemic. For the purpose of this Policy, "host high school" means the high school that a student, who pursues a Bridge Year pursuant to the provisions of P.L. 2020 c.41, attended as a junior in high school.

Under the Bridge Year Pilot Program, each high school in a school district shall designate a school staff member as a Bridge Year Liaison to serve as the school's central point of contact for students interested in pursuing a Bridge Year and for students participating in a Bridge Year. Nothing in P.L. 2020 c.41 shall be construed to require a school district to hire an individual to serve as a Bridge Year Liaison.

To be eligible to participate in the Bridge Year Pilot Program, a student shall be nineteen years of age or younger and shall not turn twenty years of age at any time during the Bridge Year, except that a classified student shall be eligible to participate if the student will turn twenty years of age during the Bridge Year due to services provided pursuant to the student's individualized education program. To participate in the Bridge Year Pilot Program, eligible students must notify their host high school's Bridge Year Liaison by February 15 of their senior year.

The Bridge Year Liaison shall develop, in consultation with Bridge Year students, an Individual Learning Plan (ILP) for each student. To ensure ample time to plan for the implementation of services outlined in the ILP, each Bridge Year student's ILP shall be completed by May 15, but no later than June 1 of the student's senior year. During the fall semester of the student's Bridge Year, the student shall take between nine and twelve credits at the host high school, the county college that serves the county of the host high school, or a combination thereof. During the spring semester of the student's Bridge Year, the student shall take between nine and twelve credits at the county college that serves the county of the host high school. During either semester of the Bridge Year, a student may also take up to three credits offered by a four-year institution of higher education at any high school in the State or at any other location to fulfill the student's credit requirement. At the conclusion of each semester of the Bridge Year, the host high school shall update the student's high school transcript to reflect any high school credits earned during the Bridge Year.

In the event that a student initially decides to pursue a Bridge Year in the fall semester, but does not continue the Bridge Year in the spring semester, the student's host high school shall release all final transcripts and other records as necessary and as may be requested. A student who decides not to continue the Bridge Year in the spring semester shall not be eligible to participate in a spring sports program or extracurricular activities pursuant to P.L. 2020 c.41.

The State Board of Education shall promulgate regulations pursuant to the "Administrative Procedure Act," P.L.1968, c.410 (<u>C.52:14B -1</u> et seq.), necessary to effectuate the provisions of P.L. 2020 c.41.

The Higher Education Student Assistance Authority shall promulgate regulations, pursuant to the "Administrative Procedure Act," P.L.1968, c.410 (<u>C.52:14B -1</u> et seq.), necessary to effectuate the provisions of subsection d. of section 2 of this Act. P.L. 2020 c.41
