### RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, Berkeley Hts Center, LLC ("Taxpayer"), the owner of Block 208, Lot 18 and Block 208, Lot 18.01 on the Township of Berkeley Heights' Tax Assessment Maps, commonly known as 411-417 Springfield Avenue and 425-427 Springfield Avenue ("Property"), filed an appeal of its 2020 through 2024 tax assessments in the Tax Court of New Jersey, Docket Nos. 010177-2020, 009499-2021, 007935-2022, 007251-2023 and 007806-2024; and

WHEREAS, the Township Council of the Township of Berkeley Heights met and discussed the aforesaid tax appeals and the recommendations of its Township Tax Assessor and its Special Tax Counsel, DiFrancesco, Bateman, Kunzman, Davis, Lehrer & Flaum, P.C.; and

WHEREAS, Block 208, Lot 18 was assessed at \$930,900 for the years under appeal; and

**WHEREAS**, Block 208, Lot 18.01 was assessed at \$313,400 for the years under appeal; and

**WHEREAS**, an acceptable settlement of the aforesaid tax appeals has been negotiated which reduces the total tax assessments levied upon Block 208, Lot 18 and Block 208, Lot 18.01; and

**WHEREAS**, the 2020 and 2021 Tax Court Complaints shall be withdrawn, and the 2020 and 2021 tax assessments shall remain unchanged; and

**WHEREAS**, the 2022 total tax assessments, based upon said reductions, will be \$805,500 instead of \$930,900 for Block 208, Lot 18 and \$285,800 instead of \$313,400 for Block 208, Lot 18.01; and

**WHEREAS**, the 2023 total tax assessments, based upon said reductions, will be \$776,300 instead of \$930,900 for Block 208, Lot 18 and \$275,400 instead of \$313,400 for Block 208, Lot 18.01; and

WHEREAS, the 2024 total tax assessments, based upon said reductions, will be \$715,300 instead of \$903,900 for Block 208, Lot 18 and \$253,800 instead of \$313,400 for Block 208, Lot 18.01; and

WHEREAS, prejudgment interest is waived provided the tax refund is paid by check payable to "Berkeley Hts Center, LLC and its attorney, Jeffrey C. Massa. Esq. of Garippa, Lotz & Giannuario" within sixty (60) days from the date of entry of the Tax Court Judgments; and

**WHEREAS,** the provisions of the Freeze Act (N.J.S.A. 54:51A-8) shall apply to the Tax Court Judgments; and

**WHEREAS,** all Counterclaims filed by the Township of Berkeley Heights shall be withdrawn at part of the settlement; and

**WHEREAS**, the Township Council leaves the allocation between land and improvements of the aforesaid tax assessment reductions to the Township of Berkeley Heights' Tax Assessor's discretion with the direction that the same be set so as to be most beneficial to the Township; and

**WHEREAS**, the aforesaid reductions have no general application to other properties within the Township of Berkeley Heights as a result of the aforesaid specific fact situation; and

WHEREAS, the Township Council makes this settlement with Taxpayer without prejudice to its dealings with any other Berkeley Heights Township's taxpayers' request for tax assessment reduction; and

**WHEREAS**, the Mayor and Township Council have reviewed a copy of the proposed Stipulation of Settlement, which is annexed hereto and incorporated herein by this reference.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Mayor and Township Council of the Township of Berkeley Heights, County of Union, State of New Jersey, as follows:

- 1. The Township of Berkeley Heights' Tax Assessor is hereby directed to establish the allocation between land and improvements of a \$805,500 total tax assessment for Block 208, Lot 18 and a \$285,800 total tax assessment for Block 208, Lot 18.01 for the 2022 tax year, which is most beneficial to the Township of Berkeley Heights and advise the Special Tax Counsel of that allocation.
- 2. The Township of Berkeley Heights' Tax Assessor is hereby directed to establish the allocation between land and improvements of a \$776,300 total tax assessment for Block 208, Lot 18 and a \$275,400 total tax assessment for Block 208, Lot 18.01 for the 2023 tax year, which is most beneficial to the Township of Berkeley Heights and advise the Special Tax Counsel of that allocation.
- 3. The Township of Berkeley Heights' Tax Assessor is hereby directed to establish the allocation between land and improvements of a \$715,300 total tax assessment for Block 208, Lot 18 and a \$253,800 total tax assessment for Block 208, Lot 18.01 for the 2024 tax year, which is most beneficial to the Township of Berkeley Heights and advise the Special Tax Counsel of that allocation.
- 4. The Special Tax Counsel, Sandra Belli, is hereby authorized to execute a Stipulation of Settlement relative to the tax appeals of Berkeley Hts Center, LLC ("Taxpayer"), Docket Nos. 010177-2020, 009499-2021, 007935-2022, 007251-2023 and 007806-2024, which withdraws the Tax Court Complaints for tax years 2020 and 2021; which reduces the total tax assessment on Block 208, Lot 18 from \$930,9000 to a total tax assessment of \$805,500 for the 2022 Tax Year; which reduces the total tax assessment on Block 208, Lot 18.01 from \$313,400 to a total tax assessment of \$285,800 for the 2022 Tax Year; which reduces the total tax assessment on Block 208, Lot 18 from \$930,9000 to a total tax assessment of \$776,300 for the 2023 Tax Year; which reduces the total tax assessment on Block 208, Lot 18.01 from \$313,400 to a total tax assessment of \$275,400 for the 2023 Tax Year; which reduces the total tax assessment on Block 208, Lot 18 from \$930,9000 to a total tax assessment of \$715,300 for the 2024 Tax Year; which reduces

the total tax assessment on Block 208, Lot 18.01 from \$313,400 to a total tax assessment of \$253,800 for the 2024 Tax Year; which provides that prejudgment interest is waived provided the tax refund is paid by check payable to "Berkeley Hts Center, LLC and its attorney, Jeffrey C. Massa. Esq. of Garippa, Lotz & Giannuario" within sixty (60) days from the date of entry of the Tax Court Judgments; which provides that the provisions of the Freeze Act (N.J.S.A. 54:51A-8) shall apply to the Tax Court Judgments; and which provides that all Counterclaims filed by the Township of Berkeley Heights shall be withdrawn as part of the settlement.

5. The settlement outlined above shall be without prejudice to the Township of Berkeley Heights' dealings with any other Township taxpayers' request for tax assessment reductions.

# RESOLUTION ACCEPTING THE BID OF THE LOWEST RESPONSIBLE BIDDER, BIOSAFE SYSTEMS LLC, TO SUPPLY THE TOWNSHIP'S WASTEWATER TREATEMENT PLANT WITH PERACETIC ACID

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Township Council of the Township of Berkeley Heights (the "Township") solicited bids for a contract (the "Contract") to supply the Township, namely, its Wastewater Treatment Plant (the "Plant"), with peracetic acid, a.k.a. PAA, for a period of three (3) years, for the Plant to use in its disinfection system; and

WHEREAS, the Township received a single bid (the "Bid"), which bid was from BioSafe Systems LLC ("BioSafe"), a company based in East Hartford, Connecticut, with a cost amount of one hundred seventy-two thousand nine hundred sixty-five dollars and zero cents (\$172,965.00); and

WHEREAS, the Township opened the Bid on November 14, 2024, at 10:00 AM; and
