



Facts About Campaign Dollars

- The Devanney BOE Campaign is Reporting a Total of \$7k in Campaign Donations So Far.
- These Donors included Scutari, Bollwage and Carter.
- Of the 8 Donors Reported So Far, the Majority are from outside of Berkeley Heights.
- The Devanney Campaign has already spent over \$9,000 on this BOE Campaign (reported *so far*).
- Some of this money went to Direct Development A vendor awarded a no-bid contract by the Township last year.

None of these facts have changed and None of This Has Been Reported by TapInto.

What TapInto DID report was data we presented directly from NJ ELEC regarding DMC's expenditures to TapInto. The numbers provided by NJ ELEC changed the day after our report, and we promptly issued an update to reflect this. However, TAPInto omitted that the data originated from NJ ELEC and that we had already updated our report following these changes, prior to the release of their article.
